



TRAVIS KELCE MAKES GOOD ON TYREEK HILL CHALLENGE AND INCLUDES SENDING AID TO LOCAL CHARITY

Kelce makes donation to Harvesters and Operation Breakthrough to help subsidize operations and provide meals to families in need

Kansas City, MO: Tyreek Hill made the call to action, and fellow Kansas City Chief Travis Kelce knew he had to show up for his teammate and their community. As the COVID-19 pandemic ravages local resources and puts thousands of Kansas City families in a stressful situation with schools and businesses closed, Hill pledged six thousand meals through his partnership with Harvesters Community Food Network and challenged his teammates to do the same. Kelce saw his six thousand meals and doubled it.

Kelce, who also has a longstanding relationship with local Kansas City organization Operation Breakthrough, knew their resources would be stretched during this time as they take care of the over 350 families who depend on them. They also anticipate their parents will have higher than usual need during the crisis, as more than 80% of the families they serve live below the poverty level. Kelce wanted to ensure the children and families who depend on Operation Breakthrough as the safe and healthy environment it's been for almost fifty years is still able to do its job. So he added a personal donation of enough funds to cover expenses for food and supplies to keep Operation Breakthrough business as usual for the next 15 weeks.

As these uncertain times cause stress and panic for so many, Kelce and his Chiefs' teammates continue to prove they're the real deal on and off the field.
